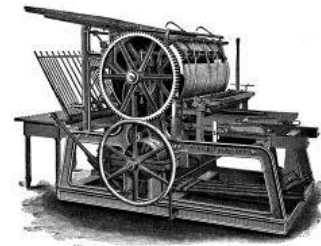
**Reference:** Chapter 5 Crossroads textbook and Internet sources.

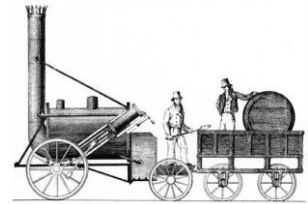
**Criteria:** (follow these closely if you want a good mark)

- Must have eight slides/pages... No more, No less
- Two slides/pages for each inventor.
- Include at least two visuals per inventor.
- Create a set of notes and attach it to this sheet to hand-in.
- Place your information under sub-headings.
- Each slide/page sub-heading should have about 5 points
- Too much information on a slide will make it difficult for the audience to process and understand.
- The slides/pages should be visually appealing and easy to understand.
- Remember PowerPoint/Prezi presentations uses point form. **Do not simply cut and paste.**
- Create a bibliography that lists the web address of the references that you have used.
- Include your bibliographic information on the last slide.
- Check your spelling, grammar, and punctuation of your assignment.



**Questions to answer when researching inventor:**

- Provide important events during his/her early life.
- List people who may have influenced the inventor.
- Explain why this individual is famous or noteworthy in their field of expertise.
- Describe the effect their contribution had on the world at the time of the accomplishment.
- Talk about their legacy today.
- Describe some of the hardships they had to overcome in order to accomplish their goals.
